### China's 'Golden Waterway'

The longest river in Asia, the Yangtze rises at around 16,000ft on a Tibetan plateau and journeys 4,000 miles across China to empty into the East China Sea at Shanghai. It is China's single most important natural asset for industry, transportation, irrigation and nowadays, hydroelectric power, and a third of China's population lives in its river basin.

### THE THREE GORGES DAM

A plan to dam the Yangtze and thereby put an end to flooding, improve navigation along the notoriously dangerous stretches through the Three Gorges, and to produce hydroelectric power was mooted in 1919 by Sun Yat-sen, the founder of the Chinese republic, but construction did not actually start until 1994. The dam itself is about a thousand miles from Shanghai, near Yichang, and is 7,761ft long, 594ft high, with a 370-mile long reservoir that encompasses the scenic Three Gorges. At the time of writing, May 2011, the 32nd and final turbine of the world's largest hydroelectric plant is ready for testing, and will shortly thereafter be completed. The dam will also have a ship lift able to raise a 3,000 ton ship in 30-40 minutes, due by 2014. There are currently 2 ship locks measuring 918ft long by 114ft wide and 16ft deep, and it takes around 4 hours to go through the 5 levels.



### **EFFECTS OF THE DAM**

Freight along the Yangtze has increased dramatically as the river is deeper, wider and therefore safer, and can take larger vessels further, reducing shipping costs and reducing environmental impact from coal burning. The risk of serious flooding has been reduced, according to estimates, from once every decade to once every century.

Since the water level rose by around 450ft within the 370-mile long reservoir in which the scenic Three Gorges are located, the landscape has undoubtedly changed - however, since the height of the mountains that line the banks is up to 4,300ft, the actual difference is not as noticeable as might be initially thought. There have been additional benefits to cruise passengers - some of the smaller tributaries of the Yangtze have now been opened up to navigation by larger cruise vessels, and other sights, such as the mountaintop temple at White Emperor City which used to involve an exhausting climb to reach, is now much easier to visit. Futhermore, travelling through the new locks and seeing the dam are actually new highlights of the cruise for many guests

This ambitious engineering project has however been controversial from the start, with 1.3 million people being relocated, farming land, towns, villages and historical sites destroyed, and suspected dangers to the environment.



### THE THREE GORGES

The Three Gorges are Qutang, Wuxia and Xiling, and each is composed of several lesser gorges often named after legends or folk tales of gods and heroes, or simply of the fancied resemblances of the mountains alongside to animals or household objects - Rhinocerous Viewing the Moon for example.

### **QUTANG GORGE**

5 miles long, the shortest but also the most scenic section. At its narrowest points, sometimes no more than 165 feet wide, the perpendicular cliffs force the river to rush through, making it fast flowing and dangerous.

### WU (WITCHES') GORGE

28 miles long, a seemingly endless number of cloud-draped canyons so high that the sun is hardly visible, giving the strange peaks a fairytale aspect - legend has it that a goddess and her 11 handmaidens were transformed into the mountains and help sailors navigate the treacherous waters below.

### **XILING GORGE**

The longest, 45 miles of rapids and shoals that claimed thousands of lives throughout history, nowadays tamed by the dam.

### THE LESSER THREE GORGES

### **DAY 1 DEPART UK**



Continue to admire poetic river views from Wanjianglou Pavilion that stands in its own bamboo park, and visit the museum of brocade before walking through Kuanzhai Lanes, lined with traditional houses decorated with intricate woodcarving and red lanterns. Later attend a Sichuan 'face-changing' Opera – see if you can spot how the performers swap their masks so quickly!

### DAY 7 HUANGLONG B D

Fly to Jiuzhaigou, Sichuan's foremost nature reserve, a land of fairy-tale beauty. Known as the Nine Village Valley after its wonderfully picturesque Tibetan settlements, it is also noted for its stunning scenery of craggy mountains, tiered waterfalls and 114 clear, jewel-like lakes. Stay two nights at the 4\*New Jiuzhai Hotel in the wildly romantic Huanglong, or Yellow Dragon, scenic area. Note that the altitude here is around 11,500ft above sea level.

### DAY 8 JIUZHAIGOU B D

These once-hidden villages are surrounded by spectacular landscapes that are home to a wealth of endemic flora and fauna. 40% of all China's plants are found here, 223 species of birds, as well as giant pandas, red pandas, Sichuan golden monkeys and Asiatic black bears.

### DAY 9 YA'AN B

Fly to Chengdu, and drive to Ya'an, a town on the old road to Tibet, calling en-route at the picturesque town of **Shangli** with its traditional houses and bridges. Stay two nights at the 4 \* Moonstar Hotel.

### DAY 10 YA'AN BID

Opened in 2003, **Bifengxia Panda Base** is one of the foremost research and breedings centres in China. Over 70 pandas live in semi-natural surroundings here, learning how to survive in the wild before they are set free.

### DAY 11 MOUNT EMEI BOD

Drive to the magnificent Giant Buddha in Leshan, a 233ft-high statue hewn into the cliffside in the 8th century in the belief it would make the treacherous river below safer for travellers. Drive to Mount Emei to stay two nights at the 4\*Emei Mountain Hotel.

### DAY 12 MOUNT EMEI B D

This is one of China's most magnificent and beloved mountains, its slopes covered in orchids, rhododendrons,

ginkgo, roses, herbs and tea, as well as thick forests and dozens of tiny temples. Take the cable car up to the Golden Summit and see the Sea of Clouds, also visit the oldest building on Mount Emei, Wannian Temple, filled with thousands of statues, and the delightful Baoguo Temple at the base.

### DAY 13 CHENGDU B

Drive to Chengdu for an overnight stay.

### DAY 14 DEPART CHINA B

Fly from Chengdu to London Heathrow via Beijing with Air China.

Instead of returning to Beijing on Day 13, fly to Shanghai for two nights at the Lansheng Hotel with a sightseeing tour of Yuyuan Garden, Jade Buddha Temple, Shanghai Museum, the Bund and Xintiandi, with lunch. Two nights with breakfast, city tour and transfers from £295 per person twin shared.



### DAY 1 DEPART UK

Fly from London Heathrow to Shanghai aboard China Eastern's non-stop flight.

### DAY 2 SHANGHAL

Upon your arrival, transfer to 4★ Shanghai Ocean Hotel for an overnight stay.

### DAY 3 GUIYANG B D

Fly to Guiyang, the capital of Guizhou province in the south of China, for an overnight stay at the 4★Trade-Point Hotel.

### DAY 4 ANSHUN B D

Drive to Anshun and the magnificent Huangguosho Waterfall, 225ft high and 265ft wide, and Tianxing Bridge beauty spot with its rocks, caves and water. Stay overnight at the 4★Anshun Hotel.

### DAY 5 KAILI B (1) (1)

Visit the Bouyei village of Tian Long where you can see a collection of the famous local di opera masks, made of wood and brightly painted, and whose menfolk still dress as they did 600 years ago when they were first sent here as frontier troops. Watch **Shiqiao** villagers make decorative paper the old way from tree bark, and the women at Qingman produce cotton and silk to make clothes. Stay at the Grand Metro Park Hotel in Kaili.

### DAY 6 XIJIANG B D

A visit to the **Minorities Culture Museum** serves as a good introduction to the customs, costumes, domestic life, crafts and festivals of the various minorities of the region, such as those of the Gejia people of Matang Village whose womenfolk are highly skilled at batik and petit point, and which we visit later. Also walk around the upper and lower Jidao Miao villages to see their waterwheels, stilt houses and the distinctive long-skirted costumes of the women. Continue to Xijiang Village, the largest Miao Village of the region of around 1,200 typical wooden houses on stilts to stay two nights at the Hotel in the Clouds.

### DAY 7 XIJIANG B D

Spend the day amidst wonderful scenery and rural charms of daily life in this authentic Miao Village. The wooden houses of Xijiang sprawl up two hillsides in the White Water River valley in the foothills of Leigong Mountain, surrounded

by terraced fields and fantastic views. Watch the farmers head off to work with their shoulder poles and buffalo, see the women display their famous cross-stitch embroidery, batik and silver headdresses in distinctive designs. Later enjoy a performance by the local Miao of their traditional music and dance.

### DAY 8 RONGJIANG B D

£2995

Today explore the home of the God of Thunder at Leigong Mountain, 7,150ft high, its slopes scattered with Shui and Miao villages. Also see the Shui villagers making bamboo musical flute-like pipes called *lusheng* – they are well known for their love of music, dance and song. After admiring the surprising mini skirts of the women of Datang we approach Rongjiang where we stay tonight at the Dongxiangmi Hotel.

### DAY 9 ZHAOXING B D

A scenic riverside drive to Basha Miao village, isolated and almost untouched by the modern world. The men have shaved heads except for a long ponytail at the top of their head twisted into a topknot, carry knives and guns, and their embroidered coat tails display how many girls' hearts they have won. Continue to Gaozeng Dong village where the girls adorn themselves with huge pieces of silver jewellery, and then on to Zhaoxing to stay two nights at the Zhaoxing Hotel.

### DAY 10 ZHAOXING B D

All Dong villages have at least one Drum Tower which serves as a watchtower and community hall, but Zhaoxing has five, one for each clan, and there are also five covered bridges known as Wind-and-Rain Bridges, and these are covered in paintings of folk tales, animals and daily life. Spend the day exploring Zhaoxing and its environs.

### DAY 11 SANJIANG B L D

Drive to Sanjiang in neighbouring Guangxi province, on the way seeing the region's famous 100-year-old wind-and-rain bridge which is a beautiful piece of architecture - its five pavilions are supported by five stone pillars and connected by roofed corridors with sweeping eaves, and the entire 250ft-long bridge is made of wood with no nails. See Sanjiang's other fine building, the 155ft high pyramid-like Drum Tower and stay at the Fengyuqiao International Hotel.





### DAY 12 LONGJI B D

Admire photogenic Gaoding Dong village which is very much off the beaten track, visit the Temple of the Three Kings, Sangwanggong, and Batuan's wind-and-rain bridge that uniquely has one aisle for people and another for livestock. Drive onwards to the breathtaking Dragon's Backbone Mountains at Longji and stay at the Star Wish Resort for two nights.

### DAY 13 LONGJI B D

There being no flat land to farm in this region, the local Zhuang and Yao people had to create their own, and so 800 years ago they started carving these mountains into ribbons of rice terraces that coil around the contours of the steep slopes. There are now over 16,300 acres of rice terraces and today walk through some of them to picturesque Ping'An village.

### DAY 14 GUILIN B D

Drive to Guilin and climb Yao Mountain along a path lined with temples and statues for fantastic views of the karst mountains that rise steeply from the river valley below as far as the eye can see. Also visit a local tea plantation and stay overnight at the *Guilin Bravo Hotel*.



### DAY 15 YANGSHUO B LD

Morning cruise along the Li River to Yangshuo through breathtakingly-lovely scenery. Time for last-minute shopping at Yangshuo's handicrafts market before a spectacular *son et lumiere* show with the 600-strong cast on rafts on the river. Stay two nights at the 5 \* Yangshuo Green Lotus Hotel.

### DAY 16 YANGSHUO B D

A day to enjoy a gentle bicycle ride along the lovely **Yulong River** and to drift through poetic landscapes on a **bamboo raft**.

### DAY 17 SHANGHAI B D

Head to the southernmost point of Taiwan and the tropical Kenting National Park to stay two nights at the 4★Howard Beach Resort. Today drive through fertile farmland to Fokuangshan Monastery, the Buddha's Light Mountain. This is a modern monastery that follows humanistic Buddhism Stay overnight in the monastery's basic but comfortable guest house, Pilgrims' Lodge.

### DAY 10 ALISHAN NATIONAL PARK [] []

You may like to join the early morning chanting, prayers, tai chi or meditation at the monastery this morning, before departing to Tainan to visit the 17th century Dutch fortress and tower that were the hub of their short-lived occupation of the island. Continue to Alishan National Scenic Area where cypress trees cover the slopes of Mount Alishan and clouds wreathe the peak, to stay at 4★ Alishan House Hotel

### DAY 11 SUN MOON LAKE (B)

Head inland to Taiwan's largest lake, Sun Moon Lake, one half of which is said to resemble the sun, the other a new moon. Stay two nights at the lake side resort 4★ Lea Lea Garden Hotel.



### DAY 10 QINGDAO B

Drive to Linzi to visit the Hall of Immolated Horses and the Football Museum – according to locals football was invented for military training several hundred years BC. Continue to the Folk Art Museum at Yangjiabu village, then head to the port of Qingdao, the twin town of Southampton, and cross the world's longest bridge over water at 26.4 miles, the Jiaozhou Bay Bridge, to stay two nights at the 4\*Huanghai Hotel.

### DAY 11 QINGDAO B

Mount Laoshan stands 3,700ft above Qingdao, said to be home to a god and a goddess who procure husbands and wives for those who come to ask for one. Enjoy rambling past rocky outcrops and waterfalls, springs of curative water, ancient Taoists temples and majestic trees.

### DAY 12 YANTAI B

The Germans occupied Qingdao in 1903 and thus was founded the **Tsingtao Beer Factory** which still produces beer today using spring water from Laoshan. After a tour of the Bavarian-style brewery drive to Penglai for two nights at the *Yantai Ramada Hotel*. Visit the **Naval Museum**.

### DAY 13 YANTAI B

Drive along the coast to Penglai to see the 14th century Fortress, cunningly built to be unseen by Japanese pirate ships who plagued the coast here. Stroll through the wooded hills of Penglai Pavilion where there are pretty temples and palaces and beautiful views out to sea.

### DAY 14 BEIJING B

It is said that the Eight Immortals of Taoism drank wine here before heading out to sea without boats. Wine is still produced today – try some at a local winery. Fly from Yantai to Beijing for an overnight stay at the 4\*Novotel Xin Qiao Hotel.

### DAY 1 DEPART UK

Fly non-stop from London Heathrow to Beijing with Qatar Airways.

### DAY 2 BEIJING D

Arrive in Beijing for a three-night stay at the 4★Novotel Xinqiao Hotel. Enjoy a welcome dinner.

### DAY 3 ROOF OF THE WORLD TRAIN (3 (1) (1)

Tour the Lama Temple where the Emperors' eunuchs used to live, and the neighbouring Confucius Temple, admire panoramic views from Jingshan Park, and explore the quaint Hutong district of Shichahai. ### **DAY 4** ROOF OF THE WORLD TRAIN

This is one of the world's greatest rail journeys, an overland expedition across the vast and remote wilderness known as 'the roof of the world' to the furthest outpost of China, and a massive feat of engineering – it is the world's highest railway and its highest point is at Tanggula Pass, 16,640ft above sea level, it incorporates 675 bridges, and 340 miles of the track are laid on permafrost.

### DAY 5 LHASA D

PRICES FROM £2595

After traversing the vast frozen expanse of the Tibetan plateau, a high-altitude desert, passing glaciers, lakes and rivers, and cutting through the immense mountain ranges that have isolated the country from the outside world until now, arrive in Lhasa this evening and transfer to the (officially 5★) 4★Brahmaputra Hotel, a modern and comfortable, hotel with many cultural artefacts on display throughout its public areas.


### DAY 6 LHASA (3 (1) (1)

The name Lhasa means 'place of the gods' and it remains a vivid and still-thriving enclave of devout Buddhism despite the increasing modernisation even of this remote corner of China. 425ft above the city on Red Mountain stands the fortress-like Potala Palace, 13 storeys high and with 1,000 rooms filled with statues, chapels, manuscripts and murals. Potala was the winter palace of the Dalai Lamas and Tibet's political and spiritual headquarters for centuries, and later visit the summer palace, Norbulingka, a complex of delightful pavilions and gardens outside the city. Visit the 15th century Sera Monastery and its Great Assembly Hall, dormitories and colleges where 10,000 monks used to live.

### DAY 7 LHASA BOD

One of the three great monasteries of Tibet, Drepung Monastery is a religious university where around 600 monks live – in its heyday before the Potola Palace was built there were over10,000 and it was the largest in the world. Free afternoon, follow the throngs of pilgrims as they make the clockwise circuit along Barkhor Street that encircles the golden-roofed Jokhang Temple, home to the most sacred Buddha statue for Tibetans.





### DAY 8 GYANTSE/SHIGASE B D

Leave Lhasa and drive along the Southern
Friendship Highway over the Kampa La mountain
pass to Yamdrok Lake, the sacred 'holy sapphire'
and female guardian of Buddhism in Tibet. Continue
past the Karo La Glacier to the small town of
Gyantze to visit Palkhor Chode Monastery and
its nine-storey pyramid-like structure known as a
kumburn with 76 chapels lined with lavish murals.
Continue to Shigatse to stay at Shigatse Hotel for
one night.

### DAY 9 SHIGASE/SHEGAR (NEW TINGRI)

Visit the red and gold Tashilungpo Monastery, founded by the first Dalai Lama in the 15th century and traditional seat of his second-in-command, the Panchen Lama, ever since. See the jewelencrusted tomb of the tragic 10th Panchen Lama, the 86ft high Maitreya Buddha statue, murals and the immense Thangka Wall. Drive through stark landscapes and over mountain passes with only occasional prayer flags providing spots of colour,

Stay an extra three nights in
Nepal at the 5★ Radisson
Hotel, with a city sightseeing
tour of Kathmandu including
Durbar Square, the Royal Palace,
stupas and temples, and a scenic

### DAY 10 MOUNT EVEREST B D

Officially the height of the world's highest mountain is 29,017ft although satellite technology says it to be 29,035ft and increasing in height by up to four inches every year as the tectonic plate under India continues to move north into China. Visit the Base Camp at 17,000ft to see the spectacular north face of Mount.





### DAY 11 ZHANGMU B D

Rejoin the Friendship Highway and drive down to the border of Tibet and Nepal at Zhangmu, descending nearly 10,000ft along winding roads. The landscapes change dramatically, with stunning waterfalls tumbling down deep valleys, thick, lush forests and a much warmer temperature. Stay the night at the modest Caiyuan Hotel.

### **DAY 12 KATHMANDU** B

Cross the Friendship Bridge into Nepal, and drive through the rich valleys to Kathmandu to stay at the 5 \* Radisson Hotel.

### DAY 1 DEPART UK

Fly non-stop from London Heathrow to Beijing with Air China.

### DAY 2 BEIJING D

On arrival in Beijing transfer to the 4★Super House International Hotel for a one-night stay. This evening take a stroll through Tiananmen Square to see Mao's Mausoleum and the Monument to the People's Heroes, symbolically right in front of the former imperial palace, the Forbidden City. Welcome dinner.

### DAY 3 DATONG BD

Visit the magnificent circular Temple of Heaven, constructed entirely of wood and with no nails, and designed according to principles of cosmology and numerology to illustrate the meeting point of heaven and earth. Take the train to Datong, strategically located between Beijing and Xian, staying for two nights at the 4★Datong Hotel.


### DAY 4 DATONG B

See the five enthroned and gilded Buddhas in Huayuan Temple that also houses the museum with its relics unearthed from ancient tombs nearby, and the glorious Nine Dragon Screen, a 100ft-long wall of colourfully glazed tiles 600 years old that used to stand in front of the palace entrance to stop evil spirits entering. Visit Yungang where caves are filled with 50,000 Buddhist statues that were carved in the 5th and 6th centuries.

### DAY 5 WUTAISHAN B

Drive to Wutai Mountain, the holiest of the four sacred Buddhist peaks of China and home to dozens of monasteries and temples that were mostly built during the Tang dynasty of the 7th to 10th centuries. Luckily, they survived Mao's Cultural Revolution as did nearby Yingxian Wooden Pagoda from the same era, the oldest and largest wooden building in China and built entirely without nails. Stay tonight at the 4★Huahui Hotel.







At the end of your tour fly to Xian, the ancient capital of China and terminus of the Silk Road, for two nights at the 4★Bell Tower Hotel, with a tour to see the Terracotta Warriors, as well as climb the ancient city wall and visit the mosque and quaint muslim guarter. From £295 per person twin shared.

### DAY 6 TAIYUAN B

Not only goods but ideas travelled along the old Silk Road to Xian, and at Datong is evidence how Buddhism travelled from India to China, here at the spectacularly-located Hanging Temple, hewn from caves in the sacred Heng Shan mountain and clinging to the cliff face, where Buddhism, Taoism and Confucianism are all celebrated. Drive to Taiyuan to stay overnight at the 4★Shanxi Hotel.

### DAY 7 PINGYAO B

Visit Jinci Temple, a one-thousand-year-old ancestral temple, before driving to the quaint old town of Pingyao. En-route visit the Qiao Family Mansion, a perfect example of traditional workmanship and design with graceful roofs, red lanterns and fine carvings. Stay two nights at Pingyao's characterful Yunjincheng Folk Guest House.

### DAY 8 PINGYAO B

A day to explore charming Pingyao's well-preserved streets and houses, China's first bank that was established here in 1823 and which brought prosperity to the town, and the great fortified City Wall, 30ft high and 15ft wide, that was needed to keep out gangs of thieves intent on robbing the rich citizens and travellers.

### DAY 9 CHANGZHI B D

On the way to Changzhi call at Pujiu Temple, founded by the wicked Empress Wu of the Tang dynasty and scene of a famous love story. Stay overnight at the 4★ Jinxin International Hotel.

### DAY 10 LUOYANG B D



Head to Luoyang to stay two nights at the 4★ Grand Hotel. This afternoon visit the renowned Longmen Grottoes where 100,000 Buddhist statues of wildly varying sizes were carved into natural caves along a half-mile stretch of the Yi River valley, mostly between the 5th and the 12th centuries.

### DAY 11 LUOYANG B (



Visit the birthplace of kung fu, Shaolin Temple, where the Buddhist monks devised this form of exercise to aid their self-discipline and to defend themselves from outside attackers, 1,500 years ago. They gained renown for their fighting prowess and the martial art became an integral part of monastic life. Then tour Kangbaiwan Manor, a Ming dynasty house like a castle the size of a village.

### DAY 12 BEIJING B





### **DAY 1 DEPART UK**

Fly non-stop from London Heathrow to Beijing with Air China.

### DAY 2 BEIJING D

On arrival transfer to the 3★Red Wall Hotel. This evening take a stroll through Tiananmen Square to see Mao's Mausoleum and the Monument to the People's Heroes. Welcome dinner.

### DAY 3 URUMQI B D

Morning free at leisure. Fly to Urumqi, an important staging post on the old Silk Road, surrounded by rich pastures. Stay two nights at the 4★Bingtuan Grand Hotel.

### DAY 4 URUMOI B

Step into another culture at the Xinjiang Museum, that of the Muslim Uyghurs of Xinjiang province, learn about their costumes, art and household artefacts – bronzes, ironwork, woodcarvings, silk of course, and weapons and also viewing the museum's collection of mummies, Bronze Age caucasians, perhaps Celts, early Silk Road travellers. Later climb Red Hill for panoramic views of Urumqi.

### DAY 5 KASHGAR B D

Fly across desert and mountain to the oasis town of Kashgar to attend Kashgar's Sunday Bazaar, for countless centuries the most important market in Central Asia, and where Uyghurs, Kazakhs, Tajiks, Kyrghiz, Uzbeks, Tatars and Mongols from far and wide still come to haggle for provisions, household goods, hats and livestock. Explore the characterful old quarter, the Tomb of the Fragrant Lady and Id Kad Mosque, and visit a local Uyghur family in their home. Stay two nights at the 3★Qinibagh Hotel.

### DAY 6 KASHGAR BOD

A dramatic drive along the famous **Kamakoram** Highway which follows one of the paths of the Silk Road to Pakistan, but today we go as far as Karakul Lake, lying in a stunning setting with snow-capped mountains all around.

### DAY 7 HOTAN BOD

A long drive skirting the Taklamakan Desert to Hotan, a major crossroads and staging post of the southern Silk Road, with an en-route visit to Yarkand, capital of an ancient Uyghur kingdom, to see the 16th century Ammanisha Tomb and the Golden Graveyard. Stay two nights at the 3★Hotan Hotel.

### DAY 8 HOTAN B D


Hotan is famous for its rare 'sheep fat' white jade – at White Jade River see if you can pick out any of this highly prized and increasingly rare treasure from the riverbed, washed down from the mountain and worn smooth and round. Visit Hotan Museum, and see the ruins of Malikwat, the capital of the pre-Islamic, Buddhist Yutian kingdom.

### **DAY 9 AKSU** BOD

Head into 'the abandoned place', the fierce Taklamakan Desert, a vast inland 'sea of death' of shifting sands that could swallow camel caravans and entire settlements, and which used to take 40 days to cross – on the new road it takes less than eight hours. Stay overnight at the 4★

### DAY 10 KUQA BOD

Continue towards Kuqa to stay two nights at the 3★Kuqa Hotel. Also visit the Thousand-Buddha Caves at Kizil, where the almost Indian and Persian-style murals depict not only the Buddha but everyday life of the locals before the region became Muslim – farming, hunting, and playing the music that was famous throughout Central Asia.



#### DAY 11 KUQA BLD

See the spectacularly-located ruins of the great 1st century **Buddhist temple** at **Subashi**, and **Kuqa Mosque** that can hold 3,000 worshippers, built in the 20th century in a typical Uyghur style.

#### DAY 12 KORLA B D


Morning drive to Korla, an oasis town blessed with abundant water and fertile farmland. Admire the Iron Fortress at the entrance to a dangerous mountain pass, and Lotus Lake, home to many waterbirds. Stay overnight at the 3 \* Bazhou Hotel.

#### DAY 13 TURPAN B D

Head to Turpan's Flaming Mountains to see Gaochang fortress, destroyed by the Mongols, the underground Astana Tombs and the Bezeklik Buddha Caves. Stay overnight at the 4\*Huozhou Hotel.

### DAY 14 TURPAN, OVERNIGHT TRAIN (B) (L) (D)

2,000 years ago the locals built an ingenious irrigation system of wells and underground channels that is still used today to grow the vines and fruit for which the town is famous. See this system at work, and also visit the ruins of Jiaohe and the elegant Emin Minaret, the highest in China. Take the overnight train to Liuyuan in a four-berth soft-sleeper compartment.



#### DAY 15 DUNHUANG B D

From Liuyuan drive to **Dunhuang** at the western end of the **Great Wall**. Visit the **City Museum's** relics from all along the Silk Road, and stay overnight at the 4\*Dunhuang Hotel.

#### DAY 16 DUNHUANG, OVERNIGHT TRAIN (B) (L) (D)

Admire the Mogao Grottoes, Buddhist cave temples used for a thousand years and decorated with sculptures and murals. Walk in the sand dunes at Mingshan Mountain to hear the 'singing sands' and see Crescent Moon Lake. Overnight train to Lanzhou.

### DAY 17 XIAHE BOD

From Lanzhou drive to Liujiaxia Reservoir on the Yellow River and take a ferry over to Bingling Temple to see the splendid but lesser-known (and therefore better-preserved) cave temples. Drive to Xiahe, known as 'little Tibet', and stay two nights at the 4\*Labrang Legend Hotel.

#### DAY 18 XIAHE BOD

Admire Labrang Monastery, the largest Tibetan monastery outside Tibet, and tour the surrounding grasslands where nomads still tend their flocks, and villages where life proceeds pretty much as it always has done.

Fly out to Beijing early for an extra two nights at the 3★ Red Wall Hotel with a superb sightseeing tour of the Bird's Nest and the Water Cube Olympic sites, the quaint quarter around Houhai Lake and the contemporary artists' galleries and workshops of Factory 798 in an industrial suburb. #### DAY 22 DEPART CHINA B

Fly non-stop from London Heathrow to Shanghai with China Eastern Airlines.

#### **DAY 2 SHANGHAI**

Stay two nights at the 4★Shanghai Ocean Hotel.

#### DAY 3 SHANGHAI B D

Stroll around the delightful Yuyuan Garden, its ponds, pavilions, paths and plants creating an infinitely varied series of exquisite views, and visit Jade Buddha Temple whose statues were carried all the way from Burma. Later walk along Shanghai's riverside promenade, the Bund, with 19th century European architecture along one bank, and the futuristic skyscrapers of Pudong opposite.

#### DAY 4 CHENGDU BD

Fly to Chengdu for two nights at the 5★Tibet Hotel. In a quaint and colourful part of the old town, step back in time as you walk along Kuanzhai Lanes, lined with traditional houses decorated with intricate woodcarving and red lanterns.

#### DAY 5 CHENGDU B D

Get close to one of the world's most adorable and endangered animals at the Panda Research Base here which both supports those living in the wild and also works on a successful breeding programme. Later attend an intriguing and entertaining Sichuan 'face-changing' Opera see if you can spot how the performers swap their masks so quickly!

#### DAY 6 LHASA BOD

Fly to Lhasa to stay four nights at the 5★Brahmaputra Hotel. The rest of the day is free to rest and acclimatise to Tibet's high altitudes, 12,000ft above sea level here in Lhasa and rising to 15,750ft later in the journey.

#### DAY 7 LHASA B D

Visit the 15th century **Sera Monastery** and its Great Assembly Hall, dormitories and colleges where 10,000 monks used to live. Later, follow the throngs of pilgrims as they make the clockwise circuit along Barkhor Street that encircles the golden-roofed Jokhang Temple, home to the most sacred Buddha statue for Tibetans.

#### DAY 8 LHASA B D

425ft above the city on Red Mountain stands the fortress-like Potala Palace, 13 storeys high

and with 1,000 rooms filled with statues, chapels, manuscripts and murals. Potala was the winter palace of the Dalai Lamas and Tibet's political and spiritual headquarters for centuries, and later you will visit the summer palace, Norbulingka, a complex of delightful pavilions and gardens outside the city.

#### DAY 9 LHASA B D

One of the three great monasteries of Tibet, Drepung Monastery is a religious university where around 600 monks live – in its heyday before the Potola Palace was built there were over 10,000 and it was the largest in the world.

#### DAY 10 GYANTZE B D

Leave Lhasa and drive along the Southern Friendship Highway in the direction of Kathmandu, over the Kampa La mountain pass to Yamdrok Lake, the sacred 'holy sapphire' and female guardian of Buddhism in Tibet. Continue past the Karo La Glacier to the small town of Gyantze and stay overnight at the 3★Gyantze Hotel.

#### DAY 11 SHIGATZE B D

This morning visit Palkhor Chode Monastery and its nine-storey pyramid-like structure known as a kumbum with 76 chapels lined with lavish murals. Continue to Shigatze to stay at the Shandong Mansion Hotel for two nights.

#### DAY 12 SHIGATZE B D

Visit the Tashilhungpo Monastery, founded by the first Dalai Lama in the 15th century and traditional seat of his second-in-command, the Panchen Lama, ever since. See the jewel-encrusted tomb of the tragic 10th Panchen Lama, the 86ft-high Maitreya Buddha statue, murals and the immense Thangka Wall.


#### DAY 13 LHASA B D

Drive back to Lhasa, 'the Ground of the Gods', through rugged scenery along the Northern Friendship Highway for a final night in Tibet.

#### DAY 14 ZHONGDIAN B D

Fly to **Zhongdian** in the north-west of China's Yunnan province, a photogenic town perched on a Himalayan plateau and once a staging post on the Southern Silk Road down to Vietnam. It was renamed Shangri La a few years ago due to its natural beauty, and we stay two nights in this 'fabled paradise' at the 4★Shiner Hotel.







#### DAY 15 ZHONGDIAN B D

Visit Songzanlin Monastery, dating from the 16th century and rebuilt following damage during the 1959 invasion of Tibet. Drive out to Napa and Shudu Lakes, surrounded by snowy mountains, forests, rich pastures and picturesque hillside hamlets. Visit one of these to meet a local Tibetan family and enjoy a hearty home-cooked dinner.

#### DAY 16 LIJIANG B

Drive south to Lijiang, once the capital of the Naxi kingdom, en-route admiring the world's deepest canyon at Tiger Leaping Gorge where the Yangtze is forced through a narrow gap in the rocks. In Lijiang visit the local beauty spots Black Dragon Pool and Lion Hill, and listen to the traditional music of the Naxi orchestra. Stay two nights at 4★Old Town Hotel.

#### DAY 17 LIIIANG BO

Take a cable car ride up sacred Jade Dragon Snow Mountain and the southernmost glacier in the northern hemisphere, and explore Lijiang's quaint old town with its 354 bridges and elaborately carved Naxi houses.

Drive south through the green, rural lands of the Bai people and pass Erhai Lake to Dali, to stay at the 4★Landscape Hotel for the night. Continue to Daxu, a charming, story-book old village of traditional wood and stone houses where life proceeds pretty much as it has done since the Ming dynasty. Stay overnight at the 4★ Guilin Bravo Hotel.

#### DAY 5 YANGSHUO B D

Today enjoy the renowned Li River Cruise to Yangshuo. The vistas from the boat are endlessly fascinating and in the distance are numberless limestone peaks shrouded in mist and covered in pine trees. 

Later visit Jiuxian Garden Village, a 1,400-year-old traditional village that is the subject of a unique conservation and regeneration project to preserve its culture and architecture with botanical gardens, a tea house, guest house and health centre also being created alongside the renovations of its Ming-era buildings. Take another tai chi class this evening.

Prepare more local specialities at the cookery school this morning, and after lunch take a gentle stroll





along the banks of the river, watching women in coolie hats washing their clothes, men fishing and buffalo bathing. Round off a relaxing day with your nightly tai chi.

### DAY 9 YANGSHUO B (

On the curve of a river, many miles from Yangshuo, is the ancient farming village of Huangyao. The flagstones have been polished to a sheen by centuries of footsteps, ancestral temples and shrines abound, graceful bridges span the rivers and creeks, and an air of timelessness pervades the tiny community, surrounded on all sides and thereby isolated from the world by the steep mountains that stand guard over it. Tai chi this evening will relax you after your excursion.

#### DAY 10 YANGSHUO B

Spend another morning at the cookery school, mastering new dishes and learning more about the region's cuisine. After lunch, take a short trip out to Fuli village where traditional hand-painted paper fans and scrolls are made in the old riverside workshops - and there is certainly plenty of inspiration for painting in the unique scenery around. Enjoy your final tai chi class.

#### DAY 11 DEPART CHINA B

#### **DAY 1 DEPART UK**

Fly non-stop from London Heathrow to Beijing with Air China.

#### DAY 2 BEIJING

Upon arrival in Beijing transfer to the 4★ Novotel Xingiao Hotel for an overnight stay.

#### DAY 3 CHENGDU (B)

Fly to the colourful and cheerful capital of Sichuan, Chengdu, to stay two nights at the  $5 \star Tibet Hotel$ .

#### DAY 4 CHENGDU B D

Get close to one of the world's most adorable and endangered animals at the Panda Research Base here which both supports those living in the wild and also works on a successful captive breeding programme. Meet your local ornithologist who will be with you until Day 19, and spend the afternoon birdwatching at a local beauty spot in the city, Huanhua Brook.

#### DAY 5 WAWUSHAN BID

Drive to the magnificent Giant Buddha in Leshan, a 233ft high statue hewn into the cliffside in the 8th century, and UNESCO World Heritage Site, before continuing to Wawu Mountain to stay overnight at the 4★Wawushan Grand Hotel at the base of the mountain. Sub-tropical Mount Wawushan is the largest National Primeval Forest Park in China, home to 300 species of birds, 31 species of amphibians, 3,500 species of plants and also the Red Panda. On the lower slopes of Wawushan are evergreen broadleaf woodland, and deciduous and coniferous forests higher up with rhododendron and bamboo. A network of forest trails and the cable car provide easy access to all areas of the mountain.

#### DAYS 6 & 7 WAWUSHAN B D

In the early mornings take the cable car to the top of Mt Wawushan (9,284ft above sea level), perhaps seeing its great display of azaleas between February and April. Bird watching with your local ornithologist, sightings of the following are possible at different levels of the mountain - woodpeckers, cuckoos, speckled woodpigeons, shrikes, corvids, flycatchers, redstarts, tits, a dozen species of warblers, laughingthrushes, grey-hooded and golden parrotbills, Sichuan treecreeper, golden bush robin, golden-breasted fulvetta, Temminck's Tragopan, Lady Amherst's pheasant and Emei Shan Liocichla. Stay at the 4★Gongtong Hotel for two nights, further up the mountainside.


#### DAY 8 DANBA (B) (D)

Drive north to Danba, a charming and prosperous region of Tibetan and Qiang minority villages, noted for their slender watchtowers that were built both for defense and communication between neighbouring villages. The distinctive architecture is sturdy and attractive - houses are like mini-fortresses, and of 3 storeys, livestock on the ground floor, the family on the first and grain and crops upstairs. Overnight at the Jiaju Tibetan Guest House.

#### DAY 9 RILONG B D

Head to the Mountain of the Four Ladies, Siguniangshan, where the landscapes are breathtaking - jagged snow-capped peaks, lush alpine meadows, forests and streams. Stay two nights at the 4★New Siguniangshan Hotel. Here we are close to the famous Wolong birding area in Balangshan, an area particularly rich in pheasants, and we may also see the local slaty bunting and Indian blue robin.







#### DAY 10 RILONG BOD

Today is spent at Balangshan, walking or driving to different high altitude spots for the best opportunities to see a variety of species in their habitats. Endemic birds possibly seen today include the snow partridge, Tibetan snowcock, white-eared pheasant, Koklass pheasant, golden pheasant, grandala, spectacled parrotbill, and firethroat.

#### DAY 11 MAERKANG B D

Drive north from Rilong to Maerkang (Barkham) with birdwatching opportunities along the way of crested tit warblers, Verreaux's monal partridge, and three banded rosefinch. Stay two nights at the 4 \* Jiarong Hotel.

#### DAY 12 MAERKANG B D

Bird watching in the Mengbishan area, looking for the local residents – the Chinese white-browed or the pink-rumped rosefinches, white-winged or collared grosbeaks, hill pigeon, Eurasian crag martin, Hodgson's redstart and white-throated redstart, blue rock thrush and winter wren, maroon-backed accentor, Himalayan redflanked bluetail, Severtzov's grouse, blood pheasant, black woodpecker, Hume's leaf and yellow-streaked warblers, goldcrest, Chinese babax, giant laughingthrush, Chinese fulvetta and Tibetan siskin.

#### DAY 13 HONGYUAN B D

Head into the Tibetan grasslands today, where shepherds tend their yaks and sheep under vast skies, and Buddhist chortens and nomadic yurts dot the landscape. The area is also known as the Red Plain, not for its colour, but to commemorate the Long March by Mao's Red Army across this empty corner of Sichuan in 1934-6. Stay at the 3 \* Hongyuan Hotel. Search for the rare Sichuan jay, Songar and white-browed tits, plain and Elliots laughingthrushes.

#### DAY 14 ZOIGE B D

High on the Tibetan plateau at Zoige (Ruoergai), visit the striking Dazha Monastery and the dramatic S-shaped First Bend of the Yellow River at the Sichuan-Gansu border. Stay two nights at the modest 2\*Ruoergai Hotel.

#### DAY 15 ZOIGE B D

At the vast wetlands around Flower Lake we find many waders and waterbirds, such as the black-necked crane, saker falcon, Chinese grey shrike, upland buzzards, blue eared pheasant, red crested pochard, ruddy shelducks, as well as black winged snowfinches, white browed tits, Tibetan larks and Godlewski buntings.

#### DAY 16 JIUZHAIGOU B D

On the drive over the Lamaling mountain pass to Jiuzhaigou, a national park and area of outstanding natural beauty, we may see the Sukatschev laughingthrush, Przevalski nuthatch, Himalayan orange-flanked bush robin and ring necked pheasant. Stay three nights at the 4\*Qianhe Hotel.

#### DAYS 17 & 18 JIUZHAIGOU B D

Search for the Rufous headed robin who is rarely seen beyond the spruce forests in the park environs here, also the Chinese nuthatch, Chinese leaf warbler and Chinese grouse, sooty tit, spotted laughingthrush, chestnutthroated partridge, the Sichuan wood owl, spectacled parrotbill, three-toed woodpecker and slaty-backed flycatchers. But perhaps above all, enjoy the magical scenery in this fairytale national park.

**DAY 19 CHENGDU (3) (b)** Reluctantly depart from this beautiful region, returning to Chengdu for an overnight stay. This evening admire the traditional architecture and charming atmosphere of **Kuanzhai Lanes** and

attend an intriguing and entertaining performance of Sichuan face-changing Opera.

#### DAY 20 CHENGDU B

Enjoy your free time in Chengdu today.
